The North Star is for the future state of Alaska, the most northerly in the union. The Dipper is for the Great Bear, symbolising strenth [strength]." A photo of Benny Benson is attached (probably after the design was submitted) to the upper right corner. Reverse is signed by members of the selection committee.  |

The competition was open to Alaska<br>schoolchildren between grades 7 and 12. Benson was a 13 year old student at the<br>Jessie Lee MIssion Home in Seward. The competition was organized by the<br>American Legion, who collected a total of 142 entries from throughout Alaska. The<br>American Legion recommended Benson's design to the Territorial Legislature, who<br>unanimously passed an act officially adopting the design. In addition to the watch,<br>the legislature granted Benson \$1000 for a trip to Washington DC to present the<br>flag to the President of the United States; however, due to scheduling problems,<br>this was not possible, so the funds were put toward Benson's future education. The<br>flag was dedicated on July 8, 1927, at the Jessie Lee Mission Home, and there<br>Benson received his first place watch. |


